## Water Augmentation Grant

Kyogle Council has received a \$6.4 million grant to upgrade Kyogle's water storage and treatment facilities.

The funding from the State Government's Water Security for Regions Program was announced last month by Water Minister Kevin Humphries and Member for Lismore Thomas George.

The water supply augmentation project has been on Council's drawing board since 2006.

#### It will include:

- Construction of a 200ML off-stream storage dam to provide drought security and consistent raw water quality
- Upgrades to Kyogle's heritage-listed water treatment plant, pictured above, to meet future demand and ensure reliable water quality to meet the Australia Drinking Water Guidelines
- Modifications to the existing on-stream weir to provide fish passage to over 400km of upstream fish habitat.
- Diversion of the waste water disposal from the water treatment plant to the sewerage system to eliminate existing direct discharge to stormwater.

## Squirrel Glider Boxes to be Erected

David Mulcahy, pictured right, from Kyogle Council's Facility Maintenance team has been busy using his construction skills to build nest boxes for squirrel gliders. The nest boxes will be erected in specific trees within the site of the new Kyogle water supply off-stream storage to offset the loss of habitat from clearing associated with the flood levee and spillway work.

The squirrel glider is a vulnerable species present on the site.

### Women in Leadership

The second Women in Leadership Workshop will be held at the Kyogle Library on Monday, 27 April from 10.30am.

It will take the form of "global café" and will be a planning session.

The first workshop, organised by Kyogle Council in partnership with TAFE, was held last month and was attended by more than 20 women.

As well as discussing the meaning of "leadership" and the barriers women face in becoming leaders, the women at the workshop were asked to describe in a "headline" their "ideal" Kyogle. From that exercise, the women developed a series of projects to reflect their ideal Kyogle.
