Penalty Notices for Fibro Dumping

Kyogle Council is looking at issuing penalty notices to people disposing of waste fibrous cement (fibro) in domestic garbage bins.

The move comes after repeated incidents over the last couple of months of Council finding fibro dumped in household bins – a practice that is placing people's health at risk and costing Council thousands of dollars.

Council's Senior Environmental Health and Waste Office David Bell said fibro may contain asbestos, a hazardous material that by law must be properly wrapped and disposed of.

"When it's simply put in a bin and picked up by a garbage truck it often ends up being mixed with the recycling," he said.

"When this happens the recyclables have to be treated as being

contaminated and tonnes of recyclables have to be buried as waste in the landfill. "Each time this occurs it costs our community. The resource that would have been used to make new products is wasted and Council has to pay the EPA for each tonne of waste buried in the landfill (currently \$65.40/tonne). "This money would be much better spent elsewhere."

Council has received advice from WorkCover that it is almost impossible to tell if fibro contains asbestos simply by looking at it.

"Determining whether material contains asbestos is a specialist field and unless a person is certain that fibro does not contain asbestos, it should be considered to be asbestos and managed appropriately," Mr Bell said.

Under the current Household Asbestos Disposal Scheme (HADS), Kyogle Council residents can obtain a free asbestos removal and disposal kit from Council's administration office. This allows for disposal of up to 10m² of asbestos per household at a reduced rate. Under the HADS, disposal of 10m² of asbestos at the Kyogle landfill costs approximately \$10.

There's been lots of talk lately about the possibility of Council amalgamations. My advice, based on the best information available, is that there's no need to panic. So much is dependent upon directions from the State Government and with an election looming at the end of March, understandably their attention is focused on other matters for the time being. In the meantime, Council has been gathering information and will be having discussions with other local governments in the area to see what they are proposing to do and working on the preparation for our own submission to the 'Fit for the Future' initiative due at the end of June 2015.

Council will identify what our best case scenario is, if amalgamations proceed and present these options to the community: What will be our position if we merge with Lismore? If we merge with Richmond Valley? If we stand alone? Once we have all of this information, the community engagement process will

begin and you will have an opportunity to participate in the decision-making process.

Scores of people took advantage of the chance to dispose of unwanted chemicals from their homes free of charge at the Kyogle Landfill on the day.


About 400kg of chemicals

Householder Disposal Scheme

Residents are encouraged to take advantage of reduced fees for asbestos disposal across the northern rivers from 1 July 2014. Landfills at Grafton, Kyagle, Lismore, Tweed and Casino will be accepting asbestos under the scheme.

The Household scheme covers bonded asbestos only. Any resident using a licensed asbestos removalist, can dispose of up to 5 Tonnes, once only and must provide proof of residential address.

Householder Asbestos kits for removing up to 10m2 are available from most participating councils.

Plaque in memory of Aunty Patsy unveiled

A memorial plaque honouring the life and achievements of the late Patsy "Bundjulahm" Nagas has been unveiled almost a year after her death.

Aunty Patsy, the first Aboriginal person elected to Kyogle Council, worked tirelessly to promote reconciliation and improve the health of indigenous people.

Described by her friends as a bridge builder, she went on to be elected Deputy Mayor of Kyogle Council and to initiate the flying of the Aboriginal flag outside the Council Chambers. Aunty Patsy died on 19 January last year after a long battle with kidney disease.

The ceremony to unveil the plaque, which has been erected at Anzac Park Kyogle, was attended by more than 200 people. The Kyogle Reconciliation Group raised about \$1,000 for the plaque and members have vowed to continue Aunty Patsy's



work to bring people together from all walks of life.

"Our focus in 2015 will continue to be on reconciliation and bringing all of our community together by acknowledging our differences and celebrating our similarities," a spokesperson for the group said.

The Reconciliation Group meets monthly (usually) on the third Thursday of the month at the Kyogle Youth Centre.

Anyone with an interest in closing the gap is encouraged to attend a meeting and gain a sense of how the committee

works and its direction. The Reconciliation Group's next direct action is to create a storyboard at the Anzac Park lagoon that tells the story of the waterhole and illustrates the importance of the waterhole in years past to Aboriginal people. To complete the project the Reconciliation Group will be fundraising, applying for grants and funding and seeking sponsorship and donations. Roxy Gallery 'Red Cedar – Now & Then' 6-7 March 2015

An amazing collection of red cedar pieces by local woodworkers will be on display at the Roxy Gallery, Kyogle, until 7 March.

This thematic exhibition promises to delight the visual senses with an abundance of glorious hues emanating from the polished cedar pieces. The intrinsic beauty of this magnificent wood is underscored by the gifted and talented woodworkers, who have individually selected each piece of timber, sculpted, honed and polished it into many different items.

Last year Marcus Durand approached the gallery director with an idea to hold an exhibition of works by the many woodworkers in our area who spend their time in their backvard sheds carvina out their ideas in red cedar and to pay homage to past master craftsman Tom Young. A total of 14 enthusiastic woodworkers came on board to show the public what they create, 'Red Cedar - Now & Then' has been supported by the Kyogle and District Arts Council with the Kyogle Historical Society providing some useful information on the timber cutters of this region. In this exhibition, two chairs by the late Tom Young, an internationally acclaimed master cabinet maker who lived and worked from his shed in Horseshoe Creek.
