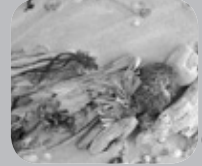

Campbells Bridge Replacement

In a trial project aimed at finding a more economical fix for Kyogle Council's aging timber bridge problem, a modular steel bridge has been installed over Doubtful Creek at Sextonville.

The bridge, sourced from surplus Australia Defence Force stock, was rolled into place in a day-long exercise earlier this month.

It replaces a failing wooden bridge

which had a load limit imposed on it. It's hoped the trial will provide the council with a more cost effective means of replacing old multi-span timber bridges than currently offered by traditional concrete multi-span structures.

If successful, Council hopes to replace a further 12 old timber bridges with the modular steel bridges over the next four years at an estimated cost of just over half the funds to build traditional concrete bridges.

Recycle your old batteries in Kyogle



Kyogle Council is calling on people to recycle their old household batteries by dropping them into the battery bin at Council's administration centre at 1 Stratheden Street, Kyogle.

The move to establish a battery bin comes after Council received a number of requests from the community regarding the safe disposal of batteries.

Batteries contain potentially harmful metals and chemicals that can impact on the environment. Stockpiles of batteries may also pose a fire risk.

Up until now, most old batteries have ended up in landfill.



Small batteries such as those used in cameras, torches, toys, tools and appliances can now be dropped into the designated 'battery bin' at the Council administration centre free of charge. Batteries that are leaking should be placed in a sealed plastic bag before disposal.

Car batteries and other large batteries may be dropped off at any of Council's landfills or transfer stations free of charge.

Swimming Pool Closures

Time is running out for people who enjoy a dip in one of Kyogle Council's three public swimming pools.

With autumn now officially here, Council has announced the closing date for the Kyogle, Woodenbong and Bonalbo pools for the 2014-2015 season.

The Kyogle pool will close on Wednesday, 8 April (the last opening day will be Tuesday, 7 April). That's good news for families who want a fun activity close to home over the Easter break.

The 8 April closing date will mean the pool will be open over the entire Easter break – except Good Friday.

From the Mayor

It's been a big month already with various meetings and workshops. Council has been busy around the *Long Term Financial Plan (LTFP)* and trying to find a way forward in terms of *Fit for the Future (FFTF)*.

Long Term Financial Plan: Councillors had a workshop recently to discuss the LTFP. Some of our figures rely on external funding so when we don't receive that funding, obviously it makes it difficult for us to deliver on the plan.

Recently, Kyogle missed out on funding through the *Federal Bridge Renewal Program* which has affected our capacity to fund the repair or replacement of additional bridges. We will be appealing this decision in Canberra but won't have a result until after March 25.

The LTFP gives us and you, the chance to see the big picture of how Council is managing the resources and service delivery of the LGA.

We have an achievable plan and a workable budget, but this budget is affected by State and Federal sources of funding. We are looking at opportunities for potential resource sharing and working across LGA borders to achieve good outcomes for our communities.

Fit for the Future: I have had a lot of people approach me about what is happening around amalgamations. The simple answer is: We don't know.

Kyogle Councillors and the General Manager had a workshop on Thursday, 12 March, prior to meeting with both Lismore and Richmond Valley Councils individually on what our best, possible, negotiated outcome could be.

We will be asking about possible cost efficiencies, maintaining (if not improving) service delivery levels and of course, representation. After these meetings have been held, we will be coming out to the community to talk to you. After all, it is your future we're talking about.

World Day of Prayer: I attended the World Day of Prayer service in Kyogle, coordinated by the Catholic Church, which was a non-denominational service. The service was very moving with Betty

Fitzgerald M/C'ing and husband Tom on the organ. Congratulations to the choir who kept us all in tune.

Meet the Candidates: The Kyogle Chamber of Commerce coordinated a "Meet the Candidates" event at the KMI. All known candidates were in attendance and answered questions relating to not only the Kyogle LGA but the Northern Rivers area. Many thanks to the Chamber and its members for coordinating the event and providing residents with an opportunity to touch base with all the candidates prior to the election.

International Women's Day: An International Women's Day event was held at the Kyogle Cinema by the Kyogle Family Support Services. It was very well attended and women of all ages enjoyed the culinary delights of Ms Sheryl Graham.

I'd like to acknowledge the local businesses for their generosity in making donations for the raffles, which raised much needed funds for the *Kyogle District Domestic Violence Committee*. A big thank you to Margaret Olive and Kay Crowther from the cinema for assisting on the day.

ANZAC Exhibition

Kyogle and District Historical Society Inc. in conjunction with Kyogle RSL sub-Branch will hold an exhibition to commemorate the Centenary of the Great War 1914-18 and the Centenary of Gallipoli 1915-2015.

Bonalbo Multipurpose Service Site

Work on finalising the design for the new Bonalbo Multipurpose Service (MPS) is progressing. Following meetings with the community, staff and the project team, two design options are being finalised with a view to present these options to the community this month.

Both options involve demolishing the current hospital buildings to provide a clear brownfield site.

Having a brownfield site will markedly reduce the construction time of the MPS and will improve the MPS building as it will be entirely a new build.

During the construction period the current health services will need to be moved to an alternative site in the Bonalbo township.

MyRoadInfoApp

Kyogle Council has announced the release of its free MyRoadInfo App for iPhones and Android devices.

The MyRoadInfo website was developed in 2010 as an online information hub listing road closures and delays due to accidents, storms or rising floodwaters.

MyRoadInfo includes the latest updates from councils and the RMS so residents have localised knowledge at their fingertips to make sensible decisions on the road.

The app's most exciting feature, which is not available on the website, is an automatic notification system. Using the 'favourites' function, residents are able



to nominate 10 favourite roads and receive automatic notifications should accidents, storms or flooding occur.

"Our number one aim is to get people safely from A to B," Kyogle Council's Executive Manager Infrastructure Works Jeff Breen said.

"The website has been very successful but we realised the next logical step was to create a simple, free app that people could download. We encourage people to give themselves and their family increased peace of mind and download the MyRoadInfo app."

MyRoadInfo won an R.H. Dougherty Award in 2013 and in February 2014 was awarded the Government Communications Australia national award for 'best crisis communications'. You can download the MyRoadInfo app via the App Store for iPhones or the Google Play Store for Android devices.

Kyogle Youth Action celebrates National Youth Week

Waste Less Recycle More

Kyogle Council has received \$65,000 in funding from the NSW Environment Protection Authority to reduce litter at events being held across the local government area.

The funding forms part of the 'Waste Less, Recycle More' initiative which aims to meet the State's reduced litter targets.

The Kyogle Council 'Waste Less, Recycle More' project will:

- Provide bins at local events free of charge
- See Council work with the community at events to ensure more litter goes in the bins and less on the ground
- Educate the community about the impacts of litter on waterways, bushland and wildlife.
- Inform and educate people that littering fines averaging \$200 apply and that litterers are being watched and will be fined.



- Let the community know how they can report littering.
- Encourage the right behaviour -- educate people to simply put their litter in the bin.

Household Asbestos Disposal Scheme

With only three months remaining of the Household Asbestos Disposal Scheme in Kyogle, there is no time like the present to deal with unwanted asbestos around your home. The scheme offers savings of up to 50% on disposal fees at participating landfills.

So far, more than one hundred tonnes of bonded asbestos have been collected across the Northern Rivers in the last six months, as part of the *NSW Environment Protection Authority (EPA), Household Asbestos Disposal Scheme*. Householders can access disposal kits from Kyogle

Council to remove and dispose of up to 10m². For larger quantities householders should use a licensed asbestos removalist who can also access the reduced fees for up to 5 tonnes per household. To access reduced asbestos disposal fees before 30 June 2015 contact Kyogle Council on 6632 1611 for details or visit www.newaste.com.au/asbestos/.

When booking a licensed asbestos removalist ensure that they are offering you reduced disposal costs under the HADS scheme. This project is a *NSW EPA Waste Less, Recycle More* initiative funded from the waste levy.

Fishway Grant



Kyogle Council has received \$40,000 under the State Government's *Habitat Action Grants* to reduce the height of the Kyogle Weir and build a new rock ramp fishway over the weir.

This will provide native fish stocks passage to 450km of habitat. A total of 31 grants totally \$575,000 were awarded to recreational angling clubs, community groups, landholders and local councils through the program to enhance and rehabilitate degraded recreational fish habitat.

"Funding for the grants was provided through the Recreational Fishing Trusts," Minister for Primary Industries Katrina Hodgkinson said when announcing the grants. *"All money raised by the NSW Recreational Fishing Fee are placed into the Recreational Fishing Trusts and spent on improving recreational fishing in NSW. "The Recreational Fishing Trust – Habitat Action Grant Program is a great example of how anglers' money is being invested back into recreational fishing."*

Kyogle Australia Day Committee Nominations

Nominations are being sought from people interested in being part of the *Kyogle Australia Day Committee*.

Interested members of the community can pick up an information pack at Kyogle Council's administration centre or download it from Council's website at www.kyogle.nsw.gov.au.

The information pack includes a nomination form as well as information about how the committee operates. The committee, which organises Kyogle's Australia Day celebrations, convenes from April until January.

Formal meetings are minimised by using electronic tools (emails and Facebook), however attendance at some formal meetings is required between October and January.

The *Australia Day Committee* is part of the *National Australia Day Awards Program* and is supported by Woolworths, Kyogle Council and the Australia Day Council. Nominations will close at 4.30pm on Monday, 20 April, 2015.

Water Restrictions

Level 1 water restrictions are still in force in Kyogle and Bonalbo.

They are expected to remain in place until at least the end of May when the need for further restrictions will be reviewed in light of stream flows and rainfall figures.

Restrictions were imposed in October last year in the wake of ongoing dry conditions and low flows in the Richmond River and Peacock Creek. Recent rain has seen flows in the Richmond River and Peacock Creek improve.

Level 1 restrictions are as follows:

Residential properties and swimming pools; Sprinklers and fixed hoses not to be used between the hours of 8am and 4pm.

Commercial Premises; Sprinklers and fixed hoses not to be used between the hours of 8am and 4pm, exemptions for sprinkler use up to 2hrs per day allowed for essential business uses such as plant nurseries, or where business hours dictate water use eg schools, public gardens, sportsgrounds.

Industrial; no restriction for water usage for essential business activities.

Rural; no restriction for stock watering.

The change of season has come around and so has the change in exhibitions at Kyogle Council's Roxy Gallery.

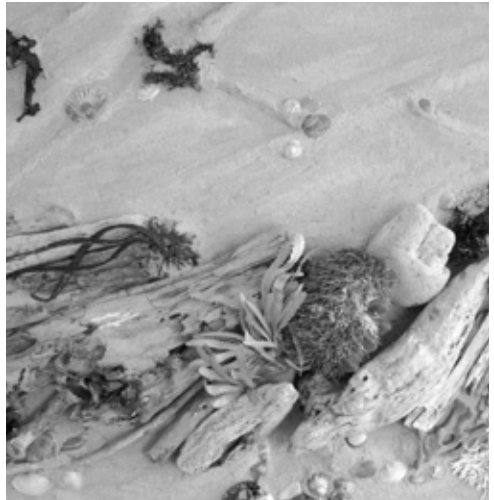
'WAG 4 Autumn' will be on exhibit from March 10 through to April 4, 2015.
