With illegal dumping costing Kyogle Council tens of thousands of dollars each year, the Council has decided to ramp up its efforts to stop people from disposing of rubbish on the side of roads and in bushland. Council, in collaboration with North East Waste, has applied for funding to increase surveillance at hot spot dumping areas and for a reduction in State Government levies for disposing of asbestos at landfill.

Dumping of asbestos in bushland and on private land has increased in the last five years.

Council's Executive Manager Planning and Environment Grea Meyers said the illegal dumping of asbestos created significant health and environmental risks for the community.

"It is difficult to identify asbestos in dump sites and increases the health risk to our rangers who are responsible for recording and reporting dumped materials," he said.

The most common items council finds illegally dumped include household furniture, white-goods, electrical waste and green waste.

"All of these items can be disposed of for a minimal cost at Kyogle and Woodenbong Waste Management Facilities and e-waste can be dropped off free of charge," Mr Meyers said. With increased surveillance at hot spot areas, council aims to collect information required to fine people



who dump their waste illegally.

"The costs of getting caught for illegal dumping are substantial, with fines as high as \$1,000,000 for corporations and \$250,000 for individuals, but the potential cost to people's health and the environment is even higher," Mr Meyers said. The council employs a range of techniques to target dumping, including unannounced checks

of facilities and asbestos removal contractors, increased surveillance of dumping hotspots and targeted patrols.
Coupled with community information and working closely with State
Government, the chances of catching would-be dumpers in 2014 have increased significantly.

## Billycart Bonanza

The inaugural Kyogle Billycart Bonanza will be held on Father's Day – Sunday, 7 September – and organisers are hoping the whole community gets behind the family event.



As well as billycart races in various classes and categories down Stratheden Street, the day will feature market stalls, a jumping castle, face painting and an animal nursery.

The event is being organised by the Kyogle Association for Christian Education (KACE), an initiative of the Churches of Kyogle and aims to bring the Kyogle and district community

There will be races for age groups from a young as five years old through to adults, with classes for traditional, homegrown, professional and novelty billycarts.

## Pet Owner's Responsibilities

To ensure the comfort, safety and health of the whole community, the Companion Animals Act places certain responsibilities on all pet owners.



Here is a brief summary of the responsibilities of dog owners under the Act:

- If your dog is in a public place it must be under the effective control of a competent person by means of an adequate chain, cord or leash that is attached to that person;
- If your dog defecates in a public place it is an offence not to remove the faeces.

Dogs are prohibited in:

- children's play areas;
- food preparation/ consumption areas;
- recreation areas, public bathing areas;
- school grounds and child care centres;
- shopping areas;
- wildlife protection areas.



# Dog registration reminders

Council is currently sending out registration reminders for dogs that are identified (microchipped) but not registered.

Unfortunately, there has been a very poor response received from the mailed out letters.

Owners of companion animals are reminded that the State Government has increased the fine to \$275 for unregistered animals.
